The present drawing relates to one of the artist's early, key portrait commissions of Mrs Elizabeth "Betty" Jameson, wife of Edinburgh solicitor John "Harry" Jameson, painted whilst Lamb was staying with the Jamesons in November 1908. The commission was probably the result of Lamb's time in Paris when he became friendly with the music student Helen Maitland who was a distant cousin of the sitter. Elizabeth was pregnant when the portrait was being painted and Lamb undertook many studies in pencil and watercolour in order to capture her as fully as possible before the pregnancy showed. The finished painting, sometimes referred to as "The Scotch Lady" is a striking full-length portrait of Elizabeth standing in a dark blue dress against a yellow/green draped backcloth.
